A visit in winter greets you with brilliant snowcovered mountains, a mild winter climate, and a lot


of activities and events to take part in, such as snowshoeing, skiing, snowmobiling, skating, curling and some of the best ice and open-water fishing in the area.





Cross Country Skiing Maps



Distance: 8.5 km one way Trip time: 3 hours Surface: Compact Dirt

Description

The Hotsprings Trail meanders its way alongside the Kuskanax Creek following the pioneers' original packhorse route of 1912. Fantastic day hike that ends up at the Nakusp Hotsprings!

While heading south on Hwy 6 make a left at Alexander Road. Drive for 2.3 km to the brown wooden Kuskanax Creek Trail sign on the right.

Modes of Use Summer: Hiking, Biking, Dirt Biking Modes of Use Winter: Snow shoeing Rating: Moderate

Distance: 4 km one way Hotsprings Trail Surface: Compact Dirt

Trip time: 5 hours return

Description

Approximately 10 km of old logging roads on a south facing slope. Watch for snowmobilers.

Access

There are 5 access points for this trail system. Access #1 is GPS pt #7 approx. 6 km up the Hotsprings road. The second access (#10) is 1 km further up the road. 0.8 km further is the third access, just past Gardner Creek and the bottling plant. 1.3 km further is access#4 (GPS pt #8). The 5th access is GPS pt #9.

Modes of Use Summer: Hiking, Biking, Dirt Biking Modes of Use Winter: X Country Skis Rating: Moderate

Distance: 9.6 Km Wensley Creek Trails Trip time: 2-3 hrs Surface: skid roads Modes of Use: ski, hike, horseback, dirtbike



Description

Just outside of Nakusp lie the Wensley Creek Cross Country Ski Trails. There is 9.6 km of groomed track skiing for both beginner and intermediate skiers.

There is a First Aid survival kit at the junction. Whiskey Jack provides more intermediate skiing terrain. Taddy Cabin, (Point 2) a newly constructed warming hut, offers shelter for a lunch break with a stove for warmth and pit toilets nearby. Another First Aid survival kit is located at the cabin.

Access

Head south from Nakusp on Highway 6 toward Nelson for about 4 km, past the Nakusp Centennial Golf Course. Turn left on Upper Brouse Road, and follow it to the top through a series of turns until reaching the parking area for the trails.

Rating: Easy

Winter conditions.....

Be prepared for winter driving conditions. Use winter tires, or carry chains.

Please pay attention to wildlife warning signs. Do not feed wildlife.


You are responsible for your own safety: please come prepared for winter wilderness conditions. We can be responsible trail users by sharing trails with other users.

PLEASE PACK OUT WHAT YOU PACK IN. Be safe and enjoy.






Summit Lake Ski Hill and Tube Park. This hill is perfect for the whole family. Affordable, fun and the food is great.
